#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Our parent Educational Institution, Shri Datta Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Panutre is a premier educational institution of Panhala Tahsil of Kolhapur District. It is established by Hon. Vitthalrao Patil in 1987. Primary and Secondary school, Multi Faculty Junior college, ITI etc are run by the society. Our college Vitthalrao Patil Mahavidyalaya (Arts, Commerce & Science) Kale earlier known as Varishtha Kala Mahavidyalaya, Kale was established in 2000. Initially, faculty of Arts was established. Commerce and Science faculties ware started in 2010. College is affiliated with Shivaji University, Kolhapur

In 2015 the college is recognized by UGC under Section 2(f) & 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1956. Initially, faculties of Arts and Commerce were established and the faculty of Science was started in 2010. Since then, our college has been imparting education in the faculties of Arts, Commerce, Science at Graduation. It has competent and experienced staff in teaching departments, well equipped laboratories, central library supported by spacious lecture rooms and playgrounds.

We have 13 permeant teaching faculties; out of them 10 faculties are Ph. D. and remaining are perusing. NAAC has reaccredited our college with C grade in its 1st cycle with CGPA 1.99 in 2015. Since then, college is followed the path of quality and excellence as per the guidance of NAAC.

### 1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

### **Curricular Aspects**

- As per the Vision of the institute and to address the growing needs of the Kale region College is running 14 crocuses under 3 Programs (Arts, Commerce and Science).
- College also runs offices for Center for Distance Education, Shivaji University Kolhapur and Study Center of YCMOU, Nashik for those who can't take regular education. These centers even offers PG programs of respective universities.
- College also introduced several Add-on Coerces to bridge the gap between existing curriculum and demands of students. 30 Certificate courses were introduced by college in assessment period.
- Syllabus of regular courses are prepared by affiliating university, however our faculty play active role in the formation of syllabus as a member of BOS Subcommittee. Also our respective faculty prepars syllabus of Add-on courses run by college. Each student can avail syllabus offline (library file) and online (college website) mode.
- College follows the curriculum prepared by university for degree courses. University itself take care of these cross-cutting issues while preparing Curriculum. College performs curricular and co-curricular activities to meet the objectives set by university.
- Through university results, continuous evaluation process and feedbacks are used to evaluate the outcomes of the curriculum.
- Feedback forms are collected from students, alumni, parent etc. every year and a report is prepared by Feedback committee. This report is used by IQAC and Principal for further course of action.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

- The admission process is carried as per the rule of Shivaji University Kolhapur. The College adheres reservation policy of the government of Maharashtra. Average percentage of enrolled students is 75.67% in assessment period. Average percentage of seats filled against seats reserved for various categories of students is 54.75% in the assessment period.
- At the beginning of academic session, the teaching departments assess learning levels of admitted students and identify advanced learners and slow learners. Then the teachers adopt appropriate teaching methods for them. Teachers uses several teaching-learning methods as per the requirement, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methods etc. For better comprehension of the subject, more emphasis is given on laboratory teaching, field and industrial visits, practical teaching. Apart from this, workshops and seminars are organized for the students. The college provided academic and infrastructural facilities to the students' i.e. a central library, well equipped laboratories, internet, computers and other ICT tools which facilitate the learning to make it more students centric. Teachers have been extensively using ICT based tools and platforms for teaching, learning and evaluation process.
- College has 14 permanent faculty, amongst them 10 are Ph. D. and remaining are perusing. All faculty members have been constantly updating their knowledge by attending seminars, conferences, workshops, and faculty development programs.
- Although all faculty members are appointed as per the eligibility criteria decided by apex bodies. However 87 % faculty members have either NET / SLET qualified or Ph. D. qualified or having both qualifications. Our Ex-Principal possess D.Lit. degree.
- The evaluation process is done by college within the framework of Shivaji University Kolhapur. College Examination Committee controls and observes continues internal assessment process.

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- Programme and course outcomes of all programmes are communicated to students in lectures. Also, student can access the same from Library and college website.
- Average pass percentage of students is 67% in the assessment period.

### Research, Innovations and Extension

- The college extends all possible help and encouragement to boost research activities in various departments by providing library, internet facilities and necessary instrumentation. Promotional and developmental activities of research are maintained and monitored by the Principal, IQAC and Research Committee of the college.
- About 120 research papers are published in various reputed journals including UGC listed and Peer Reviewed Journals.
- 10 National Seminars/Webinars, 2 IPR workshops, 3 Research Methodology workshops were conducted and several other workshops were held by college in assessment period.
- College organises Research Exhibition of faculty research in campus and off the campus.
- College has a good number of extension activities conducted by various departments and committees. Specially NSS organises several programs such as community development, communal harmony, tree plantation, water conservation, health-hygiene and awareness programs. Our vibrant departments organise extension activities which includes awareness rally, voter registration campaign, workshops, Tours, surveys, Swath Bharat Abhiyan, blood check-up camps etc.
- College is very much active in neighboring community, we conduct a good number of extension activities in neighboring society, for which we receive their recognisition, appriciation letter and awards as well.
- College is very much engajed with other institute/ organisation in rhe form of MoU, Linkages etc.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

- According to Master Plan the development of Infrastructure and Learning Recourses is going on. Institute have nearly 5 Acer hill top land near by forest, on which two buildings comprise mor than 50,000 sq. ft. built up area and a big play ground. College utilises more than 2800 sqmt. built-up area. The development is ongoing.
- In this assessment period Institute built a separate building in which 5 Science Labs are installed, few classrooms, Library etc. shifted.
- A good number of IT facilities were added such as computers, printers, projectors, internet, Wi-Fi facility, CCTV and the process is going on. College has an IT Committee which looks after the need of college time to time. With the help of MoU, IT Committee manage regular inspection, purchase, and maintenance of IT facilities.
- College has a Central Library with sufficient books, journals, and e-resources. library is fully automated
  through Vidyasagar's Integrated Library Management Software developed by Easy and Useful IT
  Solutions, Kolhapur. It subscribes N-List journals through membership and purchases books,
  periodicals, and journals as per annual budget. Library is automated and consists separate computers and
  printers for staff and student. Students and Staff can access online resources in library.
- College takes extra efforts to avail more text books for student, for that college did regular persuasion and avail donation in the form of books from SIDDHIVINAYAK MANDIR TRUST MUMBAI. To facilitate student fighting competitive examinations college succeeded to avail donation in the form of competitive examination books worth nearly Rs. 1 lakh from Zilla Parishad Member.

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• We did parodic Maintenance with the help of Support Staff and external technical experts as per the requirement.

### **Student Support and Progression**

- Earlier, being a rural, hilly and rural region the GER for the Higher Education was very poor. Specially Girls and SC/ST student's parent were reluctant for the further education. Finance and transport were two big Problems for them. College executes a systemic process to overcome this condition. Firstly, the college publishes its prospectus every year. Wide publicity insured by college while admission process is going on from website notification, what's app posting, banners at key places and lastly our best practice 'Mahavidyalaya Aaplya Dari'.
- Institute start its Vitthalrao Patil Fee Concision Scheme to the open category girl students seeking admission to self-financing courses (prior to Govt. of Maharashtra's Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Shikshan Shulk Shishyavrutti Scheme) in year 2016-17.
- We take special efforts, so that maximum student can avail all govt. scholarships. Total 2637 student's avails scholarships and other financial assistance worth Rs. 1,64,35,218.00 from state govt., central government etc. in the assessment period.
- The college encourages and develops entrepreneurial skills among the students through career-oriented courses and skill development programs. The college runs Free Competitive Examinations Career Guidance Centre.
- College is trying to start regular PG courses, till then College has established two Study Centres for Distance Education of Shivaji University and Centre for YCMOU, Nashik to avail PG courses in distance mode.
- College encourages students to participate in curricular, co-curricular activities, sports and cultural activities. College provided sports facilities to the students and conducted University Level Sports and Games competitions. In last five-year students bagged a good number of Awards/ Medals for their outstanding performance in sport/ cultural activities in last five years. The Sports department conduct Annual Sports Competition every year. Students participated in events such as Youth festival and Avishkar.
- Committees like Prevention of Sexual Harassment Committee, Anti-Ragging Committee, Internal Grievance Redressal Cell and Discipline Committee are constituted as per government norms. Placement and Carrer Guidance, Student Counselling Cell etc. are taking efforts to give helping hands for aspired youth.
- Alumni Association is registered and active.

College insures student representation and active participation in important committees like College Development Committee, IQAC, Cultural Committee, Sports Committee, NSS etc.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

• Institute has well defined Vision and Mission statement. The Vision and Mission of the institution translate in to action through an effective governance system. For that the Institution practices decentralization and participative management in academic and administration. The Principal of the college got complete authority for the smooth functioning of the institution. The Governing Body guides the Principal and Various Departments, Functional Committees/Cells/Clubs are assisting him to achieve aims and objectives. CDC and IQAC are two important policy making committees, having

representation of all stockholders.

- Institute prepared its Perspective Plan in accordance with Vision and Mission. Institution while functioning follow all rules and regulations set by apex bodies.
- E-governance policy is adopted. Admissions, Exams, Accounting and Audits, Office Administration etc. all college functioning done using ICT tools. Transparency, accessibility, accountability and accuracy is maintained with e-governance tools.
- Faculty empowerment strategies comprises timely promotion of Staff, availing various leaves, insurance cuttings, GPF/DCPS, salary certificate for various loans.
- Institute facilitate on the achievement of faculty on big occasions.
- Institute provide financial support to attending workshops, seminars, conferences etc.
- 84% of teaching faculty participated in professional development programs/FDPs.
- Institute ensures optimal utilization of resources and funds available.
- The Management is registered under Charity Commissioner, Kolhapur and Vitthalrao Patil Mahavidyalaya is register under Government of Maharashtra higher and technical education and Shivaji University, Kolhapur. **The internal audit** of the institute is conducted by the government recognized the Auditor appointed by the management. **External audit** of the institute is conducted by The Joint Director Higher and Technical Education, Kolhapur and subsequently by the State of Maharashtra.

The IQAC is established and functional. Regular meetings were held. IQAC prepares institutional Academic Calander with the consultation of departments and committees. Feedback committee submits analysis report of collected feedback for further action.

#### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

- Being a rural college, motivation for students specially girls and Scheduled Cast, OBC student to pursue higher education remains our utmost priority. And also being a hilly college our obvious focus is to inculcate environmental ethics and values amongst its stakeholders.
- In order to create inclusive environment, specially towards gender issue institute always try to provide an equal opportunity for both, girls and boys. In Mahavidyalaya Aaplya Dari faculty pays special attention towards girl students. Vitthalrao Patil Fee Concision Scheme for Girl student belonging to open category worth more than Rs 2 Lakh every year.
- To inculcate moral and human values and to inspire the students for national integrity, Institute celebrates a big number of National and International commemorative days every year.
- College staff and management are very much energy concise. We use LED bulbs everywhere. Solar bulbs and Sensor bulbs are installed. For more awareness Save Electricity boards are pasted near switchboards.
- Earlier we were very short of water. Borewells were failed. Now Village Panchayat supply us water. Sanstha has several units so still it is difficult to maintain demand and supply chain. That's why in rainy season we use to save rain water in a big tank with the help of pipeline. That stored water is used for daily needs. Still in summer we found difficulties for fulfilling demand supply gap.
- We, the staff and the student, some times under NSS unit together collect west, cut the grass, does plantation etc. a year ago we have developed a small botanical garden and a butterfly garden. Though we does not have any disabled student, but provision of Ramp and Wheel Chair is there.
- Green and Environment audits were conducted. Policies were decided on the recommendations made by Audit Committee. A big amount of Beyond the campus environmental promotion activities like Tree

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Plantation, Check Dam Construction, NSS Camps, Study tours, Collection and restoration of Orchids in forest, seed boll project etc.

• Mahavidyalaya Aaplya Dari and Environment Study and Protection Activities are two best practices.

### Institutional preparedness for NEP

### 1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

The Vision of National Education Policy is to provide skill based education for development of human resources in our nation to make India an international human resource hub. Being a university affiliated institute we follows all the guidelines regarding implementation of NEP laid down by university. Shivaji University is proactively working on the suggestions and its implementation given in the NEP. Presently, University is in process of revision of its curriculum for students admitted in session 2022-23 onwards, in which provision will be made to offer minor degrees in the fields other than the parent discipline. Academic programs are being redesigned to include Multidisciplinary /Interdisciplinary courses as subject elective courses. All Academic programs are being selected in such a way that students get maximum academic flexibility.

#### 2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The choice-based credit system is already in implementation. Our affiliating University has accepted the new educational policy-2020 and instructed us to follow the guidelines. As per the guidelines of NEP, for Multiple Entry Multiple Exit (MEME), the Academic Bank of Credit ID(ABC-ID) card is essential. Our College has registered on the ABC portal. The college appointed a Nodal Officer and a Functioning Committee for NEP 2020. The first step was to create ABC IDs of all first year admitted students. To do this task all faculty and support staff act together and succeed in registering almost all students on Digi-locker App.

### 3. Skill development:

In the rural area like Panhala tehsil, students have fewer opportunities for getting knowledge based courses and skills which will make them eligible for any kind of job. Institute takes special efforts to strengthen the soft skills of students. Institute has already been running 04 different skill based certificate courses. Some of them are university approved courses and some are designed by the institute for developing soft skills and personality of the students. The institute also provides value based education to inculcate positivity among the learners regarding, constitutional and universal human values, scientific temper, citizenship, and life-skills etc. The structure of course ensures that, every student will complete 3 courses during his graduation. With the execution of NEP – 2020 from next academic year,

	institute is very much hopeful to improve employability.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	Our College is multi-faculty. Medium of instruction of Arts, Commerce faculty is Marathi. Science faculty has English medium. Apart from that Hindi is another language which is taught to Arts faculty. Departments also run few short term certificate courses, like Hindi Anuwad, Modilipi, Proof Reading in Marathi etc. these courses are available for all faculty students. Respective departments organizes programs like Hindi Din, Marathi Raj Bhasha Gaurav Din etc. so that every student got enlightened of it. The syllabus is provided to teachers and students through Library and College website. The IQAC prepares academic calendar of the college. The academic calendar specifies suitable available dates for significant academic and other activities. The head of department distributes and assign the workload considering the workload and planning held in the department meetings. Faculty members prepare semester wise teaching plans for theory and practical at the beginning of every term/semester. Each teacher provided with an academic diary containing time table, workload, annual/ semester teaching plan and academic and administrative committee responsibilities. At the end of each semester portion completion reports are submitted by the teachers. The effective transmission and delivery of curriculum departments integrate classroom teaching with various ICT tools, laboratory practical, field projects, student seminars, question paper solving, research projects, field survey etc. For the up graduation of subject related knowledge, college organizes seminar, conference and workshops, Departments organizes Guest Lectures, class seminars, group discussions, debate- essay competitions, wall paper publications, celebrations of special days etc.

Based on this academic calendar of Shivaji University Kolhapur, the college prepares its academic calendar. First of all concerned subject departments and committees prepare their respective academic calendars prior to the commencement of every academic year. Then the IQAC prepares academic calendar of the college. The academic calendar specifies suitable available dates for significant academic and other activities. The college follows evaluation schedule and pattern of Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The College Examination Committee administers and sees that the examinations are conducted according to the schedule. The examination committee work includes planning, scheduling and conduction of internal evaluation methods like Class Tests, Term End Examination, re-term Examination, Midterm Tests, Tutorials, Class Presentations, Multiple Choice Question Tests, Quiz, Group Discussions, Research Projects, Physical Education Tests and Home assignments etc. University introduced Choice Based Credit System, college conduct internal examination for the same courses for BA, BCom and BSc programs. The pattern, marking system, schedule, syllabus etc. is communicated to students well in advance, so that they can deliver their best.

Students may have several grievances at different level. College, as per the university guidelines has developed efficient mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances. The college strictly follows the guidelines and rules of the affiliating university related to transparency. There is an examination committee at college level comprising of teaching and non-teaching staff as its members. It handles issues regarding evaluation process.

Internal evaluation regarding continues evaluation process is governed under the college examination committee. Respective teachers distribute evaluated answer scripts of class tests and other exams to students and seeks clarifications or grievances if any which are, then, addressed by the concerned subject teacher.

Resolving student grievances regarding Internal Evaluation of university examinations is a systemic process laid down by university. There may be grievance regarding less marking or showing absentee of a present student. This may happen as a human error. If so, then after receiving student application of the same, college examination committee thoroughly check record, if the record is otherwise than college corresponds to university immediately and make sure that student should get deserving marks.

Three faculty members are recognized Research Guides of affiliating University, 20 students are pursuing Ph. D. under their guidance.

Our Library has subscription of online digital library and few online journals. Apart from that internet facility for staff and student is also made available under the supervision of library staff.

Our Physical Education & Sports Department is a kind of incubation center in itself. A big number of students take inspiration from Department specially our Physical Director and participate in sports activities. Physical Education & Sports Department also motivate students to prepare themselves for Maharashtra Police Recruitment, as a result of that several sportsmen get selected in police department.

Nearly 15 days all 70 villages surrounding college were get detached from urban area. In such a situation our NSS Committee take imitative and help villages to remove mud and waste around them.

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#### **Best Practice I**

#### 1. Title of the Practice - "Mahavidyalaya Aapalya Dari" (College on Your Door)

#### 2. Goals

- To bring maximum First Generation Student in the flow of Higher Education.
- Create awareness among students and their parents about higher education.
- Motivate Girl students and their parents for UG and PG admission.
- To fulfil educational need of the regional learners.
- **3. The Context -** For bringing maximum students in the flow of higher education we decided that we must go door to door of students, who passed XII exam, also reach to those who left their education because of various reasons during graduation, to understand their problems. Therefore in June 2009 initially we started this activity.
- **4. The Practice -** After declaration of results of XII standard, proper homework and planning is done. After that Faculty members visit about 40 villages by motorcycle to persuade students for UG and PG admission. We pay special attention to girl students for increasing their participation in higher education. We persuade the parents who are unwilling and afraid of sending their daughters to college for security reason.

Once the admission process is over, Principal with some faculty member visits some neighboring villages where we arranged an interactive meeting with some eminent and responsible persons of the village and parents of our students. Principal addressed the parents, villagers and tried to communicate the objectives and priorities of the college. He tried to know the difficulties and problems of parents, villagers. This free frank discussion between Principal and parents/ villagers removed so many doubts and misconceptions of parents/ villagers.

#### 5. Evidence of Success -

- Consistently increase in enrolment and result
- Understanding the needs of society through two way communication channel.
- Regular interaction with Student, Alumni and Parent.

#### 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- Unawareness and unwillingness of mostly uneducated parents to send their students specially girl students for higher educations.
- Most of the parent seeks financial assistance from college, but college can provide financial relaxation/assistance to limited students.
- The weather (rain) especially at the time of admission process is a big problem for our faculty.

#### **Best Practice - II**

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#### A) Title: Environment Study and Protection Activities

#### Goals / Objectives :

- 1) To know the environmental heritage of the region.
- 2) To create awareness about the environmental issues.
- 3) To take a step towards solving the problems and conservation of the environmental heritage.

#### The Context:

It is well known fact that the process of development deeply affecting the environment. The college situated at Western Ghat of Kolhapur district called **Sahyadri** in Maharashtra. According to UNESCO it is older than Himalaya. It is also among ten **hottest biodiversity hotspots** in the world. It has over 7,402 species of flowering plants, 1,814 species of non-flowering plants, 139 mammal species, 508 bird species, 227 reptile species, 179 amphibian species, 290 freshwater fish species, and 6,000 insect species. It is likely that many undiscovered species live in the Western Ghats. At least 325 globally threatened species occur in the Western Ghats.

Being a Hilly and Rural college, we consider it is our prime responsibility to play an active role in our capacity to create awareness amongst students and parents located in the region.

#### The Practice:

College has Botany, Zoology departments, NSS committee and Geography as a subject through which the bunch of activities related to Study, Awareness and Protection of Environment are being carried out.

To know the heritage of the region activities like study tours, guest lectures, wallpapers, exhibitions etc. were organised in college and in nearby villages.

To create awareness about the environmental problems rallies, exhibitions, environment projects, celebration of days and other programmes were organised by departments and committees.

To play active role in environment conservation activities like tree plantation, check dam construction, orchid collection and restoration in forest, seed boll project, promotion of Ujawala Gas Yojna etc. were organised.

As a result of these activities, we can surlily say that our staff, students and neighbouring society get informed, aware and became active in environment protection. Protection of surrounding environment is our national responsibility. College is nearby forest, department conducts several activities that helps in save tree from cutting in forest.
